Internship program for college students - WMAR's year-round internship program is offered to college juniors, seniors and graduate students interested in a career in broadcasting. Students receive credit for their participation in the program and are evaluated by the assigned department upon completion. Internships are available during the spring, summer and fall in all aspects of news production, promotions, newscast operations, sports, community affairs, website, sales and research. For information regarding this program please contact Pat Bihy, 410-372-2320 or email bihy@wmar.com. Four interns participated in the program during this reporting period. All of the interns were paid.

Internship/Shadow program for high school students - This two week program is offered in May of each year to senior high school students with an interest in a career in broadcasting. The program is limited to five students who each have an opportunity to shadow a reporter, interact with other news department employees (technicians, photographers, editors, producers, etc.), learn about writing for a newscast and website, and the construction of a newscast. In this reporting period the station sponsored two high school students.

Teen Media Project is an opportunity for 12 students from area high schools to attend weekly full day sessions at WMAR-TV where they receive instruction, guidance and information in the process of creating a fully produced half-hour newscast. A producer is assigned to the project and serves as coordinator. Other station personnel (reporters, directors, photographers and department managers) participate in the educational sessions providing further information about job duties, responsibilities and careers in the broadcast media. Additionally outside professionals such as instructors are also invited as guest speakers. The students themselves must research, interview, write and produce their own newscast which airs the last Saturday of the month, November through May. The students are also taken on field trips which in the past have included the Newseum in Washington, DC, the ABC network studios in New York and tapings of a live show such as Good Morning America, The Chew, etc.

Public Service Announcement:

The station has created a public service announcement which is broadcast twice a week on a rotating schedule. The announcement advises the viewing community that interested parties are encouraged to contact the station if they wish their organization receive notices of job opportunities as they become available.

Station Tours: The station provides guided tours for groups and organizations with an interest in learning about broadcasting, journalism, careers in the media. Guests are provided a "back stage" tour and are able to observe the operations of the station as well as watch a newscast. They are given an opportunity to meet and talk with staff members while learning about the various duties and responsibilities of job positions.
